10 Welcoming Practices

O ne of the things I like about our congregation at St. Stephen is that you make people welcome when they visit. There is no perfection obviously, but a smile goes a long way, and you do that very well.

We know that it's not enough being welcoming for a congregation to grow. We must be inviting, caring for our community neighbors and a true companion particularly in times of need.

However, as I was browsing the internet I came across some ideas other people share about being welcoming in congregations and I think it is good for us to take a look at how we may even improve what we already do good. I adapted these to our situation. And don't forget that first im-

pressions are key. **1.** We could introduce ourselves if we are not sure we know someone and wait for their names back. That way we are just showing that we want them to make sure they know who we are. After we hear their name, we should repeat it in order to learn it. Try not to say "Is this your first time here?" If they have visited before and had some contact with you, they may feel hurt that you don't remember. Instead say something like, "It is so good you are here. Just in case, my name is..."



2. How about trying to sit in a different place where we usually sit. Perhaps we will meet someone we are not so acquainted with.

3. Ask a visitor to sit with you. They might have questions and this may help them also not to feel too strange to everything, especially if they are new to the Lutheran Liturgy. **4.** Some people feel uncomfortable if they are called to stand out by rising their hand or standing up. A general welcome by the pastor is all what is needed.

5. Try contacting a visitor during the week and not just wait until next Sunday, or not just expecting

the pastor will do it. Start by giving them your email.

6. Don't be too friendly, just be genuine. People may feel smothered and that can get to be uncomfortable.

7. Expect visitors at our church. After all, we are in a vacationing area. Some probably have just moved in and are looking for a new place to worship and call their own. Or maybe they are new Snow Birds or considering becoming one.
8. Always say, "Thank you for being here,

you for being here, we're glad you came!" 9. Be helpful, if you see someone struggling with bags, umbrellas, or something, ask "May I help you with that?" **10.** Invite them to join you or your group for lunch! This may happen a few times a year, but some experts say this is what gives the highest rate in returns to a church than anything else.

You have a great personality already. Let's

keep growing in that love!
