



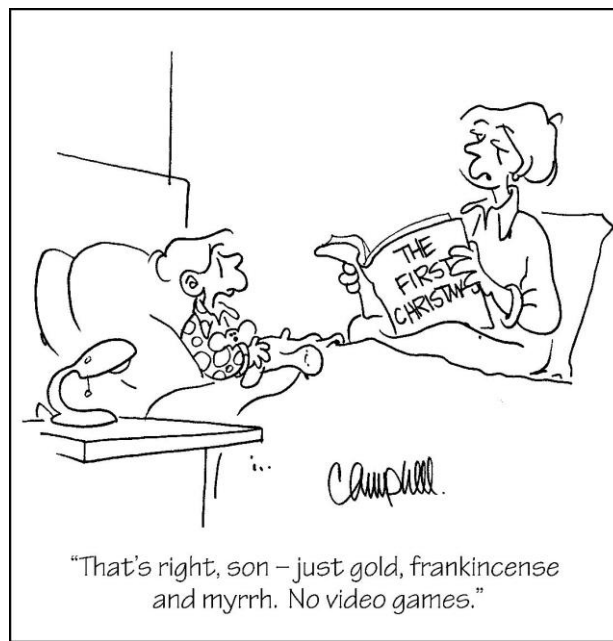

**Thirsty and give you drink?**

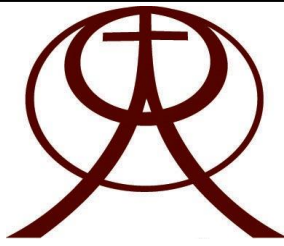
**Naked and give you clothes?**
