#### FIRST READING: Acts 10:34-43

A reading from Acts.

<sup>34</sup>Peter began to speak to [the people]: "I truly understand that God shows no partiality, <sup>35</sup>but in every nation anyone who fears him and does what is right is acceptable to him. <sup>36</sup>You know the message he sent to the people of Israel, preaching peace by Jesus Christ—he is Lord of all. <sup>37</sup>That message spread throughout Judea, beginning in Galilee after the baptism that John announced: <sup>38</sup>how God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the Holy Spirit and with power; how he went about doing good and healing all who were oppressed by the devil, for God was with him. <sup>39</sup>We are witnesses to all that he did both in Judea and in Jerusalem. They put him to death by hanging him on a tree; <sup>40</sup>but God raised him on the third day and allowed him to appear, <sup>41</sup>not to all the people but to us who were chosen by God as witnesses, and who ate and drank with him after he rose from the dead. <sup>42</sup>He commanded us to preach to the people and to testify that he is the one ordained by God as judge of the living and the dead. <sup>43</sup>All the prophets testify about him that everyone who believes in him receives forgiveness of sins through his name."


A reading from First Corinthians.

<sup>19</sup>If for this life only we have hoped in Christ, we are of all people most to be pitied. <sup>20</sup>But in fact Christ has been raised from the dead, the first fruits of those who have died. <sup>21</sup>For since death came through a human being, the resurrection of the dead has also come through a human being; <sup>22</sup>for as all die in Adam, so all will be made alive in Christ. <sup>23</sup>But each in his own order: Christ the first fruits, then at his coming those who belong to Christ. <sup>24</sup>Then comes the end, when he hands over the kingdom to God the Father, after he has destroyed every ruler and every authority and power. <sup>25</sup>For he must reign until he has put all his enemies under his feet. <sup>26</sup>The last enemy to be destroyed is death.

# GOSPEL: John 20:1-18

# P: The Holy Gospel, according to John. C: Glory to you, O Lord.

Early on the first day of the week, while it was still dark, Mary Magdalene came to the tomb and saw that the stone had been removed from the tomb. <sup>2</sup>So she ran and went to Simon Peter and the other disciple, the one whom Jesus loved, and said to them, "They have taken the Lord out of the tomb, and we do not know where they have laid him." <sup>3</sup>Then Peter and the other disciple set out and went toward the tomb. <sup>4</sup>The two were running together, but the other disciple outran Peter and reached the tomb first. <sup>5</sup>He bent down to look in and saw the linen wrappings lying there, but he did not go in. <sup>6</sup>Then Simon Peter came, following him, and went into the tomb. He saw the linen wrappings lying there, <sup>7</sup>and the cloth that had been on Jesus' head, not lying with the linen wrappings but rolled up in a place by itself. <sup>8</sup>Then the other disciple, who reached the tomb first, also went in, and he saw and believed; <sup>9</sup>for as yet they did not understand the scripture, that he must rise from the dead. <sup>10</sup>Then the disciples returned to their homes.

<sup>11</sup>But Mary stood weeping outside the tomb. As she wept, she bent over to look into the tomb; <sup>12</sup>and she saw two angels in white, sitting where the body of Jesus had been lying, one at the head and the other at the feet. <sup>13</sup>They said to her, "Woman, why are you weeping?" She said to them, "They have taken away my Lord, and I do not know where they have laid him." <sup>14</sup>When she had said this, she turned around and saw Jesus standing there, but she did not know that it was Jesus. <sup>15</sup>Jesus said to her, "Woman, why are you weeping? Whom are you looking for?" Supposing him to be the gardener, she said to him, "Sir, if you have carried him away, tell me where you have laid him, and I will take him away." <sup>16</sup>Jesus said to her, "Mary!" She turned and said to him in Hebrew, "Rabbouni!" (which means Teacher). <sup>17</sup>Jesus said to her, "Do not hold on to me, because I have not yet ascended to the Father. But go to my brothers and say to them, 'I am ascending to my Father and your Father, to my God and your God.'" <sup>18</sup>Mary Magdalene went and announced to the disciples, "I have seen the Lord"; and she told them that he had said these things to her.



# Holy Baptism with Affirmation of Baptism

God brings those who are baptized out of death and into life

#### Introduction

The candidate for baptism, and sponsors, gather at the font together with those making public affirmation of baptism and with the ministers. The assembly may be seated. The presiding minister may address the assembly in these or similar words.

God, who is rich in mercy and love, gives us a new birth into a living hope through the sacrament of baptism. By water and the Word, God delivers us from sin and death and raises us to new life in Jesus Christ. We are united with all the baptized in the one body of Christ, anointed with the gift of the Holy Spirit, and joined in God's mission for the life of the world.

#### **Presentation for Baptism**

Sponsors for the candidate for baptism, presents the candidate.

I present Randell Lee Mottesheard for baptism.

The presiding minister addresses candidates who are able to answer for themselves. Randy, called by the Holy Spirit, trusting in the grace and love of God, do you desire to be

baptized into Christ? *The candidate responds:* 

I do.

The presiding minister addresses sponsors of candidates for baptism. Sponsor, do you promise to nurture *this person* in the Christian faith as you are empowered by God's Spirit, and to help *him* live in the covenant of baptism and in communion with the church?

Response: I do

#### **Presentation for Affirmation of Baptism**

A sponsor or another representative of the congregation presents those making affirmation. I present Alexis Mitchell, who desires to make public affirmation of her baptism as we all affirm our baptism at Easter.

The assembly stands.

#### **Profession of Faith**

The presiding minister addresses candidates for baptism and the assembly making Easter affirmation of baptism.

Dear friends, through the paschal mystery we have been buried with Christ in baptism, so that we may rise with him to a new life. Now that we have completed our Lenten observance, let us renew the promises we made in baptism when we renounced Satan and all the works of evil, and promised to serve God faithfully in the holy Catholic Church. And so:

Do you renounce the devil and all the forces that defy God?

Response:

#### I renounce them.

Do you renounce the powers of this world that rebel against God? *Response:* 

#### I renounce them.

Do you renounce the ways of sin that draw you from God? *Response:* 

#### I renounce them.

The presiding minister addresses the candidates and the assembly. Do you believe in God the Father?

I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.

Do you believe in Jesus Christ, the Son of God? I believe in Jesus Christ, God's only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit,

born of the virgin Mary,
suffered under Pontius Pilate,
was crucified, died, and was buried;
he descended to the dead.
On the third day he rose again;
he ascended into heaven,
he is seated at the right hand of the Father,
and he will come to judge the living and the dead.

Do you believe in God the Holy Spirit? I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting.

#### **Affirmation of Baptism**

The presiding minister addresses the entire assembly as they renew their baptismal covenant.

Alexis, and all God's people affirming baptism today:

You have made public profession of your faith.

Do you intend to continue in the covenant God made with you in holy baptism: to live among God's faithful people, to hear the word of God and share in the Lord's supper, to proclaim the good news of God in Christ through word and deed, to serve all people, following the example of Jesus, and to strive for justice and peace in all the earth?

Response: I do, and I ask God to help and guide me.

#### Thanksgiving at the Font

The presiding minister leads the following or another form of the thanksgiving.

The Lord be with you.

# And also with you.

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

It is right to give our thanks and praise.

The presiding minister gives thanks over the water.

...through our Savior Jesus Christ, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever.

#### Amen.

#### Baptism

The assembly may be seated. The presiding minister baptizes each candidate.

The candidate is immersed into the water, or water is poured on the candidate's head, as the presiding minister says:

Randell Lee, I baptize you in the name of the Father,

The candidate is immersed or water is poured on the candidate's head a second time: and of the Son.

The candidate is immersed or water is poured on the candidate's head a third time: and of the Holy Spirit. **Amen.** 

Clothed with Christ in baptism, the newly baptized may receive a baptismal garment.

*The presiding minister continues:* 

Let us pray.

We give you thanks, O God, ...

...both now and forever.

#### Amen.

The presiding minister marks the sign of the cross on the forehead of the newly baptized. Sacred Chrism prepared for this purpose is used. As the sign of the cross is made, the minister says: Randell Lee, child of God, you have been sealed by the Holy Spirit and marked with the cross of Christ forever. **Amen.** 

#### Welcome

A lighted candle may be given to each of the newly baptized as a representative of the congregation says: Let your light so shine before others that they may see your good works and glorify your Father in heaven.

The ministers and those gathered at the font face the assembly. A representative of the congregation addresses the assembly.

Let us welcome the newly baptized and rejoice with Alexis our new member.

We rejoice with you in the life of baptism.

Together we will give thanks and praise to God and proclaim the good news to all the world.



The service continues with the prayers of intercession.

#### PRAYERS OF INTERCESSION

A: Trusting God's promise of new life, we pray for the renewal of the church, the world, and all of creation.

After each petition of the prayer is said:

A: Hear us O God,

C: Your mercy is great.

P: We commend these and all our prayers to you, O God. Come near to us with your saving help, for the sake of Jesus Christ, our risen Lord.

C: Amen.

#### PEACE

P: The peace of Christ be with you always.

C: And also with you.

After all have greeted each other the assembly is seated.

#### **MEAL**

God feeds us with the presence of Jesus Christ.







The assembly is seated.






Gluten free bread is available on the right side. (please ask) Alcohol free wine is available on the right side. (please ask)

# Healthy Congregation Retreat is April 26 and 27—Please join us!


The Office of the Bishop of the Florida-Bahamas Synod expects that within the first year of the arrival of a new pastor, that members every congregation will participate in a healthy





# Assisting ministers needed at worship!



"Liturgy" means "public service" or "work of the people." When we gather for worship an ordained pastor presides, but the liturgy is the work of the entire assembly and there are many roles. One of the most important is what *Evangelical Lutheran Worship* calls "Assisting Minister." 
