



# **OFFERING PRAYER**


#### A: Let us pray.

At St. Stephen we receive Holy Communion by receiving the bread and then either drinking directly from the cup or by intinction: That means that you may **receive the bread in your hand and then dip bread in the wine**.)

*Gluten free bread is available* on the right side. (please ask) *Alcohol free wine is available* on the right side. (please ask)




### About today's service of Lessons and Carols

The form of the Service of the Word that we use on this First Sunday of Christmas is of relatively recent origin. A similar service was first used in a English cathedral on Christmas Eve in 1878. Following that the service has subsequently been in continuous use (with modifications) in Truro, England since 1880, and followed Bishop Benson in his new appointment as

Archbishop of Canterbury in 1883. The original liturgy has since been adapted and used by other churches all over the world. Lessons and Carols most often occur in Anglican churches. However, numerous Christian denominations, including our own, have adopted this service, or a variation on this service, as part of their Christmas celebrations. In the UK, the service has become the standard format for school carol services.

### Bible Study Resumes in January: The Book of Acts

This was the last week of Advent Sunday Morning Bible Study: "While We Wait"—Beginning Tuesday, January 8 we start a new weekly study of the Book of the Acts of the Apostles. We will gather for this conversation in the Luther Room every Tuesday from 7—8pm. Acts tells the story of the early church. It traces the growth of the church from a small group of Jewish believers in Jerusalem to a worldwide movement that included both Jews and Gentiles. This book still both gives the church



its marching orders and shows how the Holy Spirit will guide us in mission. Bring a bible and a friend and join us Tuesday evenings!
