In so doing we prepare the way for the coming of the Lord and assist all flesh in capturing a vision of the "salvation of God."





Change for Change Tower: Let's keep helping the homeless and hungry in December

This month we continue the mission emphasis we started in November. Our Change for Change Tower collection will continue to go to the St. Laurence Homeless Shelter in Pompano Beach (1698 Blount Road—next to Broward Outreach Center). This ministry which is sponsored by our full-communion partners in The Episcopal Church provides an array of services for clients who are homeless and hungry. 
Today is Commitment Sunday at St. Stephen


