INTRODUCTION

In Deuteronomy God promises to raise up a prophet like Moses, who will speak for God; in Psalm 111 God shows the people the power of God's works. We encounter that authority in God's word, around which we gather, the word that trumps any lesser spirit that would claim power over us, freeing us to follow Jesus.





We lift them to the Lord.


Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.




Reception of Communion

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Why are we doing attendance cards every week?

This is the shortlist of why we are doing it. In fact, there are many more but it would get boring to write them all. So, here are just a few reasons:

- 1. So we can grow! Visitors seem to gladly fill out our attendance cards with contact information. Previously the old system did not seem that inviting to them. Now we can contact them and invite them to join. Whoopee!
- 2. It is a convenient way to solicit prayer requests. This enriches our prayer life.
- 3. Communicate communicate communicate. We need stronger communication at Saint Steven and this is one of many improvements available. How wonderful it is to get this kind of information instead of being in the dark: "I'm going into the hospital on Thursday; I need offering envelopes; can we sing hymn #503: my daughter had a baby last week; could Pastor Nelson stop by my house? "This is awesome". Every week we get information like this. Before we did not.
- 4. Do I need to fill out the whole card every week?! Absolutely not! If you have already filled out the information one time, we can update our records. After that, kindly just put your name so we know that you were in worship. I use cards that only have names on them to remind myself to speak with that person that week; write a note; or do something for him or her. Even a card with only a name on it is extremely helpful (Pastor Nelson)
- 5. Can I just stick it in the hymnal every week? Only if you want to make the usher (your friend) do extra work and have to walk down each pew pulling out attendance cards to be thrown away. They are not recyclable because they change week to week. (Please help the ministry of the church. Enter your name and place it in the offering plate. It's not hard at all)
- The attendance card can be modified week to week so that we can take an occasional survey (like today's Lenten survey) or recruit volunteers to help with something (like today's request to help clean up the Luther room)

There are more reasons, but these should be enough. I thank you for your weekly kindness in helping your church to grow strong, healthy, and vibrant.
