





FIRST READING: Isaiah 6:1-8



SECOND READING: Romans 8:12-17



When we cry, "Abba! Father!" ¹⁶it is that very Spirit bearing witness with our spirit that we are children of God, ¹⁷and if children, then heirs, heirs of God and joint heirs with Christ—if, in fact, we suffer with him so that we may also be glorified with him.

Can one enter a second time into the mother's womb and be born?" ⁵Jesus answered, "Very truly, I tell you, no one can enter the kingdom of God without being born of water and Spirit. ⁶What is born of the flesh is flesh, and what is born of the Spirit is spirit. ⑦Do not be astonished that I said to you, 'You must be born from above.' ®The wind blows where it chooses, and you hear the sound of it, but you do not know where it comes from or where it goes. So it is with everyone who is born of the Spirit." ⁰Nicodemus said to him, "How can these things be?" ¹0Jesus answered him, "Are you a teacher of Israel, and yet you do not understand these things?

¹¹"Very truly, I tell you, we speak of what we know and testify to what we have seen; yet you do not receive our testimony. ¹²If I have told you about earthly things and you do not believe, how can you believe if I tell you about heavenly things? ¹³No one has ascended into heaven except the one who descended from heaven, the Son of Man. ¹⁴And just as Moses lifted up the serpent in the wilderness, so must the Son of Man be lifted up, ¹⁵that whoever believes in him may have eternal life.


Holy Communion (Our communion is by intinction: Receive the bread and dip bread in the wine.)



Victor Jortack was born in Argentina in a Jewish Family. He became Christian as he was in the US as a foreign student with AFS. He was baptized in his new church, Trinity Lutheran church, Long Lake, MN in 1971.

He started his academic life with a Primary School Teacher degree, then a Lawyer, Master of Educational Psychology, a Master of Divinity and Doctor of Theology. Worked in Argentina as a Private Law Attorney, a Judge and College Professor.

He moved to the US in 1989 and after his Master of Divinity, from Luther Northwestern Theological Seminary, was called to churches in Minnesota, Florida and Wisconsin. He celebrated simultaneously his 25th anniversary of ordination and his retirement last December, after serving a UCC church for 12 years.

He started playing the guitar when he was 9, and initially played in radio, TV and Festivals. Using his training as a singer, and complementing his knowledge with classes at Moorhead State University, he started composing music for the church about 28 years ago. He writes music with a Latin flavor as he tries to convey a message of joy as a new Christian. He has published numerous hymns and songs, many of them in the ELCA Spanish hymnal *Libro de Liturgia y Cántico*, while most of his work is in English and unpublished (400 + songs).

He recently relocated to Lauderdale Lakes, FL, where he lives with his wife Alicia.
