A Letter from Our Pastor

Dear sisters and brothers,

The weekend of April 26 and 27 about 20 members of the St. Stephen community participated in a Healthy Congregations Retreat sponsored by the Office of the Bishop and facilitated by Pr. Don Reiter. The purpose of the retreat is to promote healthier, stronger, more mission-focused congregations. I want to share a few thoughts especially for those of you who did not participate.

The New Testament speaks of the church as a living system — "the body of Christ." St. Paul makes it clear that the body of Christ is a whole comprised of many parts, yet functioning as one. So, what are some things that help create health in congregations? What advances rather than impedes vibrant mission in local congregations? I invite you to simply take a few minutes to read each point on this partial list, and then intentionally take a moment to reflect on what that might mean specifically for you and how you can play your part in making St. Stephen a healthy, vibrant, missional community:

Healthy congregations –

- \Rightarrow Accept differences, rather than deny them.
- \Rightarrow Focus on their strengths, rather than weaknesses
- \Rightarrow Focus on mission, rather than "getting along," the past, survival, the pastor, or some other thing or issue.
- \Rightarrow Respond to anxiety and change, rather than react.
- \Rightarrow Manage conflict, rather than deny it.
- \Rightarrow Act flexibly and creatively instead of rigidly
- \Rightarrow Leaders challenge people, instead of comforting them.
- ⇒ People empower others, rather than dominating them (permission givers, not "gate keepers")
- \Rightarrow Practice stewardship gratefully and willingly, rather than begrudgingly.
- \Rightarrow Hospitality is offered equally to all, instead of favoritism for the few or the like -minded.
- \Rightarrow Beginning again is a way of life, instead of staying stuck (it is Easter after all!!!)






Living Lutheran series: What is that Big Candle up front?

WHAT IS THE SIGNIFICANCE OF THE PASCHAL CANDLE?




Throughout the 50 Days of Easter, the Paschal (or Easter) Candle burns on the left side (the "gospel side") of the altar at every service. It is inscribed and blessed each year at the Vigil of Easter and is the primary symbol of the Risen Christ in the church. It is our visual reminder that Christ is risen!

As the sign of the risen Christ, after the Feast of Pentecost, it is moved to a position next to the baptismal font and lit at every baptism, It also is lit at every funeral. The lit Paschal Candle on these occasions reminds us that baptism joins us to Christ's death and resurrection and death completes our baptismal journey to Christ. Alleluia! Christ is risen!

Check out our Bible Study: The Book of Acts

We have resumed our weekly study of the Book of the Acts of the Apostles. It is not too late to join! We gather for this conversation in the Luther Room every Tuesday from 7—8pm. The class will be repeated Sunday mornings at 9:15am in the Pastor's Office (Room 1). Acts tells the story of the early church. It traces the growth of the church from a small group of Jewish believers in Jerusalem to a worldwide movement that included both Jews and Gentiles. This book still both gives the church its marching orders and shows how the Holy Spirit will
