


Come to worship this Sunday, September 26

This week we will celebrate the 18th Sunday After Pentecost. We continue to hear readings from the Gospel of Mark. This week, someone who isn't part of Jesus' own circle is casting out demons in Jesus' name, and the disciples want him stopped. They appeal to Jesus, as Joshua did to Moses about the elders who prophesied without official authorization. Like Moses, Jesus refuses to see this as a threat. Jesus welcomes good being done in his name, even when it is not under his control. The circle we form around Jesus' word must be able to value good being done in ways we wouldn't do it; by people we can't keep tabs on.

Following guidance from our bishop and the CDC, please wear a mask when you are at worship, and maintain social distancing, until the COVID numbers get better. We will sing only a verse or two of the hymns and will not return to

fellowship following worship at this time. Don't forget, in addition to in person worship, the Liturgy will be livestreamed on Facebook and the website as well.
